

SERMON - Dwelling in Jesus' peace (John 19:19-31)

Christ is risen! (He is risen indeed, Alleluia!) Last week we were celebrating Easter, today, and even in the next few weeks leading up to the Pentecost Sunday in June, we will be still rejoicing in the victory that God the Son has won for us. While at the same time, we will see how merciful and kind our risen Lord is towards his disciples and to us as well. Let us pray: Lord Jesus, open our hearts and minds to hear your Word, your Word alone gives us life. Amen.

Today's Gospel story actually happened in the same day of Mary Magdalene's finding of the empty tomb. That was in the morning of the first day of the week. Now it is the evening of the same day. But strange enough, the disciples did not cheer up with the good news they just heard in the morning that their Lord had been resurrected. Instead, they hid themselves by locking down in a room for fear of the Jews. Pretty much like nowadays we take self-isolation and lock down ourselves at home for fear of coronavirus COVID-19.

Even the great news of being risen and alive of Jesus Christ cannot cast out their fear. Or maybe the news itself scared the disciples because among these people, someone run away from the Lord when Jesus was arrested, was spit on, ridiculed, and beaten, nailed to a cross, and hung from it until he took his final breath; Someone denied the Lord not once but three times. Who knows the resurrected Lord would take what kind of actions—vengeance with terrible wrath full of angry, bitter, and judgmental? That could cause great fear!

But neither the locked door keeps the resurrected Jesus out of the house, nor the wall stop him coming in and standing among them. Surprisingly, they met their Lord who was so good, so gentle without any anger, without any bitter, without any

judgement or condemnation, without any sense of wrath and punishment. Instead, he gave them the most needed greeting: “Peace be with you.”

What an astonished encounter the disciples had with Jesus. He does not appear to them in the way they have expected and feared. Jesus doesn't show up angry, bitter, and judgmental. He doesn't order them to give him answers to why they denied, betrayed, or even hid from him. He doesn't demand that they ask him for forgiveness. Instead, he just shows up, holds out his wrists so that they can touch the holes where he had been nailed to the cross and points to his side so they can see the gash where he had been stabbed with a spear, and he says: “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” It is very profound. Jesus just embraces his disciples by his inclusive greeting—Father sent me, then I send you, so peace be with you. I cannot imagine what else can be more comforting than this touching words to the frightened and panic disciples. They are included in God's family.

You see, instead of coming with vengeance and wrath – as the disciples had feared – Jesus just shows up to them – in the midst of their fears and failures – and immediately and freely offers them the peace, love, and grace of God – before they even have the chance to open their mouths to explain their actions or to ask him for forgiveness. Jesus just shows up to them in that small room where they were hiding from and avoiding him – because Jesus wanted them to know that no matter what, they are claimed as God's beloved children and are cherished and loved by God unconditionally.

In fact, when Jesus greeted his disciples with peace, he offers them something very special. Peace, equivalent to Hebrew word “Shalom.” It is more than a feeling of ease, or happiness, or a pleasant belief that everything is going to be all right. Far more than that, Jesus' peace has teeth in it. It is the outcome of his blood, his sweat, and his tears. It is the peace that flows as gift of salvation by his suffering, his death on the Cross, and his victorious resurrection on Easter.

Certainly, the world cannot give this kind of peace to us. The world only offers us earthly peace which cannot last for more than few days before our toilet paper is about to run out. Our good career, our good marks for exams, our living in luxury, our strong connections with others, or our health condition— none of these can truly bring us peace. A tiny coronavirus can crash down all of these things.

Whereas the peace of Jesus Christ is the only peace lasting forever. Because this peace strongly connects with the last word Jesus said on the Cross before he breathed his last and died: “It is finished.” Now he said to his disciples twice “Peace be with you” and breathed on them the Holy Spirit. Can you see the great exchange happened here? Jesus' suffering for the peace given to his friends; Jesus' last

breath for the Holy Spirit breathed into the disciples when he meets them for the first time after Easter.

The peace of Jesus streamed down from the Cross. That is exactly the victory Jesus proclaimed on the Cross – “It is finished.” Because the ransom of our sin is done by him on the cross, so we received the peace from him as well. Such intrinsic reality and truth keep us in faith, in hope and in love with our risen Lord, so that we can face all the turmoil and uncertainty in our lives boldly, even in the face of coronavirus for example, with Jesus’ peace.

Why we are so lucky to have the privilege to receive Jesus’ peace, his “Shalom?” The answer is in our baptism. For, just as Jesus showed up to his disciples claiming them as God’s beloved children, Jesus shows up to us in and through our baptism, as well.

Our baptism promises that even in our times of fear, doubts, and questioning – and even when we choose to deny, flee, and hide behind closed and locked doors – Jesus has and will show up. He claims us as God’s beloved children – no matter our failures or actions against him – and he offers us his peace and grace before we can even ask for forgiveness or even acknowledge our wrongs.

And even if we, like Thomas, miss the first or second or third time Jesus shows up and even if we shut our eyes, turn the other way, or go out the backdoor when he comes to us in order to avoid him, Jesus will keep on lovingly and patiently returning to us over and over and over again until we are ready to open our eyes to see him, reach out our hands to touch him, and accept the peace, forgiveness, and unconditional love he offers us by confessing “My Lord and my God. (John 20:28)”

In our baptism, we are claimed by our compassionate and merciful God – who loves us in and through all of our failures, our insecurities, our doubts and our questions. In our baptism, we are called and welcomed into this Kingdom of God that is full of grace, even grace upon grace.

So as we continue to journey through this Easter season, learning to live as Easter people and proclaiming the good news that Jesus has risen, let us also continue to remember our baptism. Let us remember that each one of us has been welcomed into the Kingdom of God and each one of us is and will always be claimed by God as God’s beloved and cherished child. Because no matter what we do or say or think, in the midst of all of our fears, failures, and doubts, Jesus will keep on showing up to us, offering us God’s peace whenever we are ready to accept it. And no matter how imperfect we may be – just like the earliest disciples, Jesus continues to call out to us in and through our baptism: “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.”

So let us go – as Jesus sends us – out into the world as Easter people, proclaiming this good news that **Christ is risen! he is risen indeed! Alleluia!**

May the peace of God, which passes all understanding, guard our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.
